INTROVERT OR EXTROVERT?



While I do not normally read nonfiction, every once in a while a subject catches my eye. Susan Cain's *New York Times* bestseller *Quiet* is a book about the power of introverts in a

world that can't stop talking. Cain argues that we "...dramatically undervalue introverts and shows how much we lose in doing so." Her book identifies the differences between introverts and extroverts and explains how American history of valuing extroverts came about. The book "reads" easily for a factual subject.

In teaching, our staff had several inservices regarding helping students learn, and we took the Myers-Briggs personality test. The test is a simple multiple choice test. When I took it in my 20's, I was an introvert. By the time I took it in my late 40's,I was on the cusp. If you haven't taken it, you might find it interesting. It is very probably the most accurate personality test.

Community at the Corner

"Where it all comes together" was the original motto of the City of Murrieta, emphasizing the importance of community: come together = *com-unity*.

At the Friends' Corner Bookstore we have abundant opportunity to gather and to serve the community. Book lovers "just love this place," as we often hear. Not only can they buy books at reasonable prices, they can recycle the books they just would not have the heart to throw away. They also meet other books lovers, share favorites, and discover new authors.

The space we have allows us to serve the needs of special needs students and adults. We have participated in the Work Ability Program of the MVUSD for about eight years, and we also provide volunteer opportunities for adults of two Day Care programs. One of the students (with a stuttering problem) from the first year of Work Ability ended up flourishing: he has just graduated from San Jacinto, and has been working his way through college as a cashier at the Super Target, so I get to see him periodically to catch up.

You may recall that the grant the library received which enabled the building of the "new" library had a requirement to interface with the school district. We are able to participate in fulfilling that by offering high school students the opportunity to complete their required volunteer service hours. This has been another win-win situation, and I might add, a great joy. We have had so many wonderful students through the years, and a number love it so much that they just keep volunteering after they have met their minimum requirement. Emily Ferrell, who has been coming for three years, loves to work at the sidewalk sales. She even changed her flight to visit her grandmother so she could work at the last one! We will also be having our first "grandchild" any day now as one of our former teens is married and expecting a boy. We suggested naming him Booker (as in T. Washington), but I don't think she's buying that.

We volunteers are a community among ourselves. Working with similarly dedicated people is rewarding, and literally every one says what keeps them doing it is that "it's fun!" The fun is the interface with so many in our community, the sharing of books and life stories.

As we know, community is basically what it's all about in Murrieta (and why we love living here!). The recent change which has placed the Library under the umbrella of the Community Services Department further strengthens the concept. What we are able to do at the Corner Store is not only to raise funds for the library, but to join in its goal to "meet the educational, intellectual, cultural, and entertainment needs of the community." I know the Town Square store also shares this feeling of pride and pleasure in serving our community and our Murrieta Public Library.

None of this community service would be possible without the generosity of the property owners Yasi, Incorporated. Over the five years of our current lease, they have donated over \$120,000 in reduced rent. To Yasi and to the property managers, Parkstone, Inc., we owe an *enormous* debt of gratitude, and the undying thanks of the Library, the Friends, and the community!

Join the community at the Corner, "where it all comes together."

HAPPY 2014!

First of all, I'd like to thank you ALL for your tireless efforts in raising money for the Library in 2013. Your dedication and hard work never ceases to amaze and it is always very much appreciated by the Library staff and the community.

The Library started off the new year with the merging of Young Adult and Teen books. The Teen books that were housed on the children's side of the Library have now joined the Young Adult collection on the opposite side of the Library. This will make it much easier for the teens to browse the wonderful collection that is geared toward middle school and high school patrons looking for a great read.

The winter, spring and summer programs are already planned and includes the regular Mother Goose and Me and the Wee Wiggler storytimes. In addition, there are a variety of programs such as a PSAT practice test and results workshop and Chocolate Creations for the teens. The popular Star Party is back for families to come and explore the night sky with the Temecula Valley Astronomers. Upcoming programs for adults include California Native Plants with Master Gardner Laura Simpson. She will talk about the wide variety of drought resistant California native plants to create a water-smart and beautiful garden. Genealogy Basics will be presented by instructor Michelle Norris who will share tips and discuss the best research strategies to trace your roots.


