#### Elephant Book By Vicki Constantine Croke

I never knew much about Burma, but in this non-fiction book through the eyes of Bill (Elephant) Williams I learned about this country, its existence as a British colony, and elephants and their contribution to World War II. They achieved extraordinary feats. The animal-human bond is vividly brought to life. At one time, Bill had over 1,000 elephants in his company. They were hidden from the Japanese as they built bridges and roads. The description of life in the jungle and how the British kept "civilized" living is vivid.

I have always been fascinated by elephants. The book illustrates that their way of living and communicating is very unusual. The giant elephant Bandula who is a hero in the book along with his friend Bill become true heroes in our history. They saved many Indian, British and American lives.

November is a time of giving thanks and I'd like to take this opportunity to say THANK YOU, **Friends**, for all you do to support the Library: The many hours volunteering in the bookstores, fundraising, or just touting the Library to every new person you meet. We couldn't do what we do without YOU!

Upcoming programs at the Library: Bring the whole family to the **Half Sleep Over** where attendees can wear their pajamas and enjoy snacks, crafts and books galore! **Pigeon Party**, for ages 3-12, is a celebration of Mo Willems' character, Pigeon. For teens, there is an **Icing on the Cupcakes** program as well as a practice combo test featuring the **New SAT vs. the ACT**. For adults, there will be a **Military to Civilian Job Search Workshop** as well as **Mixed Media Card Making**, **Holiday Cookie Decorating** and a **Murrieta History Scavenger Hunt** program. The scavenger hunt is for ages 14 and up and designed to showcase the many wonderful items in the Heritage Room and give participants a chance to learn a little Murrieta history. The Library has added a new language learning database called Pronunciator. Pronunciator offers 80 languages to learn and that number is growing. One of the great things about Pronunciator is that you can learn any language, in virtually any other language. Each language course has on average 9,600 instructional phrases, and 2 years of guided instruction. Plus, Pronunciator offers ESL for speakers of 50 non-English languages as well as citizenship preparation. Pronunciator can be used with mobile devices and your progress is automatically synced between your devices, so you can go from laptop to mobile phone to tablet without missing a beat. The holiday season will soon be upon us!
