2015 is off to a good start. Maggie Pilotte and Judy Call have another exciting schedule of authors and artists lined up for the monthly general meetings. I encourage you to come out and enjoy these programs. Bring a friend.

The month of January was off to a solid beginning for the year. In 2014, the revenue for the Friends exceeded Library requests once again. This was aided by strong Internet sales. Last Booknotes I praised all the volunteers. This issue I want to recognize Brian Youens, Art and Laurie Razo and Maggie Pilotte for their work with Internet sales. Over the past few years, in store revenue has decreased but Internet sales have been great, accounting for approximately 44% of book sales in 2014.

This year will be interesting because of the potential impact of e-books. The impact on Friends revenue hopefully will not be significant. My reason for this is that much of what has transferred to e-books is mass market fiction. While working the Town Square store recently I noted that about 90% of the sales were specialty books that as yet don't fit well in the e-book market. These are kids' books, cook books, collectibles, classics, history, non-fiction. I will do a 2015 revenue update later in the year.

I encourage you when deciding what to give as gifts to consider a gift certificate from one of the stores.

See you at the store. People who read are generally very interesting to converse with so come visit us and share your input on good books.

Our Murrieta Public Library

When someone mentions "library," the first thing that comes to mind, of course, is *books*. When someone in Murrieta says "library," with heart-felt pride we think *us*. *Community* is the "how" and the "why" *our* Library is in and at the heart of Murrieta and is, in fact, the most frequented spot in the city. *Community* is what makes our Library unique.

A grass-roots *community* organization, the **Friends of the Murrieta Library** was formed specifically to bring a library to Murrieta. Three years of cajoling, coercing, and twisting arms at the city, county, and state levels finally paid off, turning a vacant bank into our very own MURRIETA PUBLIC LIBRARY in 1999, replete with a Children's section in the former safe. The investment bore returns on March 17, 2007, with the building of a contemporary, classic, and elegant Library.

Our Murrieta Public Library is indeed a building full of books, but it is so much more. In contrast to the "shhh" image of days gone by, each morning, noon, and evening the young, the wise, and the in-between fill the Library with the quiet sounds of pages turning, mouses clicking, books being checked out, books being returned, research questions answered, ideas exchanging, activities engaging, children giggling, friends crossing paths. The energy of *Community* is palpable from minds inquiring, learning, researching, and enjoying. Our children are brought into the wonderful world of books by imaginative and diverse programs, covering the gamut from story time and reading groups, to group activities and classes. Get them into the Library, and the books will speak for themselves! And all of this is free.


None of this would be possible without *our* exemplary Library Manager and her extraordinary staff. Since 1999, the community of Murrieta has grown from 35,000 to more than 100,000, and the librarians have seamlessly and creatively risen to the challenge of meeting the educational, cultural, and entertainment needs of *our community*. They go above and beyond their routine duties to keep abreast of the latest technologies and trends, inventively implementing them in this tough economy. *Our* Library offers a number of computer-based resources such as tutorial classes and tests; live homework help; job search and workplace skills; language learning; and access to the World Book Encyclopedia, reference books, newspapers, and magazines. The defining characteristic of *our* Library staff is that they **care.** And all of this is free.

Anyone can go into a library expecting certain services; in *our community* the services are provided with a smile, with a *genuine interest and caring* that not only enlightens the mind, but enlivens the heart. They make *our* Library a veritable "Care Package." A "beneficial virus," if you will, the attitude then becomes contagious in the *community* outside the walls of the Library itself.

An additional way *community support* works with *our* Library to meet its mission outside its wall, is by the efforts of the **Friends of the Murrieta Library.** Once its original goal of bringing a library to Murrieta was accomplished, the **Friends** began its fundraising efforts to provide the Library with the means to broaden its services and to reach out to every member of the *community*. The **Friends** operate two bookstores (with a total of 3,700 square feet), which, in addition to being a source of revenue, provide additional services to the *community*: a source of affordably priced books, a recycling center for used books, a place to meet fellow bibliophiles, and an opportunity for volunteering. Funds from the **Friends** support the many youth and teen programs offered at the Library, and have filled in a few "blank spots" left by the current economy. The Friends purchased a lovely grand piano for the Library *Community* Room, providing yet another dimension of *community* enrichment.

Just as a book is only brought to life by someone reading it, *our MURRIETA PUBLIC LIBRARY* is a vital entity brought to life and purpose by the dedicated participation and pride of ownership of *our* community. Happy Anniversary on their 8th year in this wonderful state-of-the-art facility.




OUR MISSION STATEMENT
