

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Over the past several months, the Board has been in discussion over the renewal of the

lease for the Corner Store. Although we were able to negotiate a reduced rent, a misunderstanding of the financial status of the Friends' organization exists. The financial goals that were set to initially justify the expansion of the store 5 years ago have fallen short. The goal of having a great store for customers has been attained. Contrary to some opinions, the Corner Store has not lost money.

What I recognized and the Board agrees is that there is an unintentional lack of transparency in the financial reporting to the Friends' organization. This is causing the misunderstanding. We have agreed to take steps to keep the organization better informed. The type of information missing is cumulative year to date figures, year to year comparison, and actual versus forecast. The format and frequency of this communication is yet to be determined. I will in the next paragraph try to give you a current picture.

In order to determine where we are headed, we needed to determine what are the Library needs. I asked Elise Malkowski, Library Manager to give us a two part forecast. First is the usual request based on what we have been supplying the past few years. The second is are there extras that they could use. This is best guess as it is dependent on the City budget cycles. The first figure is approximately \$48,000 a year. The Board has already approved the 2014 request. In 2013 net income from the Corner in store sales was \$3,136 plus \$11,457 from internet sales. The Town Square in store amount was \$27,015 and \$12,902 from Internet sales. This totals to over \$53,000. Dues, donations and extra events add to this total by 5 to 10K. So we can easily cover the basic Library 48K request. However, the Library needs funds to implement the second phase which is an upgrade to install their own e-book system and other 21st century electronic options for users. We are still clarifying costs on that but the first estimate is an initial one-time cost of \$18,000+ and an ongoing yearly cost of \$16,000. The question is do the Friends want to help with some part of this?

The thing we have to watch is what is happening to revenue at both stores. Revenue at Town Square has dropped every year for the past five years and is down 13% this year to date through March versus last year. The Corner Store dropped 4.4% last year and is down through March 6.4% this year compared to last year. On the bright side, internet sales are up and will hopefully sustain that trend. All in all, with the reduced rent and strong internet sales, the 2014 total net income should approximate 2013.

Although the Board voted to extend the Corner Store lease for 5 years at a reduced rate, the store must guard against having a significant decline in revenue from in store sales. That is why we need to monitor what is happening on an ongoing basis. I will have a trends update and an explanation of the library phase 2 costs in the next book notes. This will include an opportunity for individuals to assist the library with donations to procure lesser cost electronic items.

The Friends continues to be a great organization.

Do you enjoy books about humans and animal interactions and relationships like Marley and Me? If you



### MURRIETA PUBLIC LIBRARY NEWS

...from Elise Malkowski, Library Manager

Dear Friends,

As the summer season approaches, I realize that it's been a year since I became the Library Services Manager and I want to thank you for making my transition so easy and delightful—it has truly been a wonderful year! Without your sponsorship and cooperation, the Murrieta Public Library could not offer all that it does: new books, DVDs and music CDs, informative databases, and quality programming. With much appreciation, we again accept almost \$50,000 from the Friends to go towards the Library's collection, supplies and events for this fiscal year. Thank you for being such a supportive, collaborative partner with the Library!

The Library celebrated its 15<sup>th</sup> birthday on April 10<sup>th</sup> and patrons were offered gift bags to mark the occasion of this exciting benchmark! Other notable highlights of spring included the launch of the very successful Children's LEGO Club and the Super Hero Party – both brought in over 60+ kids each! The LEGO creations the children constructed can be seen in the Library's display cases. Springtime also saw the continuation of the popular Kaplan test series for teens and March marked the debut of the new Book Club for adults.

With summer imminent, that means that the Library is gearing up for the Summer Reading Program which begins June 16<sup>th</sup> and runs through July 26<sup>th</sup>. The theme this year is Paws to Read! Our intrepid Teen Librarian, Joyce Brown, has again secured a donor to support the teen component of the program, Read for a Reason, earning money for homeless animals. For every 100 pages read and reported, \$1.00 goes to support the Animal Friends of the Valleys. Read for a Reason is sponsored by Laurie Blanscet, DO, and this year's goal is \$1,200. Of course the Children's and Adult departments are also offering exciting programs and prizes for their respective Summer Reading components as well. In other news, the Library will be receiving \$5,000 in Library and Technology Act funding from the State to purchase materials to support Common Core school curriculum. These materials will strengthen the Children and Teen collections. Also coming soon will be new tile in the Heritage Room, which will help prevent any future water damage to the floors from intense rain storms. Other preventative measures are being researched. The exact date for installation is not known at this time.

Once again I would like to thank the Friends of the Murrieta Library for all you do in your tireless efforts to raise money and your dedication towards our wonderful Library. As we enter our 16<sup>th</sup> year, I know we will only get better with your support and partnership!
