I am a fan of Greg Isles, a New York Times bestselling author. He has written fifteen books. His latest crime novel is *Natchez Burning* which is a sequel to the *Devil's Punchbowl*. I recommend you read that novel first to meet the characters.

Natchez Burning is a thriller which also provides a history lesson rooted in the real-life racial divides of the Deep South. It contains themes about race, violence, tradition, and family. As Stephen King says, "There's a bonus: you'll finish knowing a great deal about the Deep South's painful struggle toward racial equality, and the bloody road between Then and Now."

MURRIETA PUBLIC LIBRARY NEWS

As in past years, the Summer groups of our community kicked off June 16th. It is with host these wonderful programs and supplies makes our the staff and me: a huge do. In other news, the Library received an additional \$2,000 in LSTA funds from the State Library in April. The money is made available for California's public libraries to purchase popular fiction print material. LSTA Grants are provided by the California State Library to assist libraries and library-related agencies with developing programs and projects that enhance library service for all Californians. In February it was announced that we would receive \$5,000 in LSTA funds to be used to support the Common Core curriculum by strengthening our fiction and non-fiction collections for students, educators and parents.

San Bernardino County Library (SBCL) moved to its own catalog effective July 1, 2014. Therefore, SBCL patrons will no longer be able to place holds on books that belong to non-San Bernardino County libraries. Also, patrons from other libraries will not be able to place holds on books that belong to the SBCL. If you find that you cannot place a hold on an item, please see one of the library staff members who will be happy to discuss other ways of getting the item. SBCL cards are no longer accepted at the Murrieta Public Library or Riverside County Libraries. Patrons who have a San Bernardino County library card will need to get a Murrieta Public Library card or Riverside County Library Card.

Last year on June 18th, the Murrieta City Council approved the Library's Operating Budget for fiscal years 2013-14 and 2014-15. The Library budget for fiscal year 2014-15 totals \$2,033,541. The budget remains status quo with the exception of an additional \$20,000 for collection development in the second fiscal year. The Library funding is almost entirely dependent on property tax which comprises ninety percent of the revenue received. The Library Fund receives about one and one half cents of every dollar paid in ad valorem property tax. This equates to about \$37 per year for a home valued at \$250,000. To balance the 2014-15 budget, the Library will use \$303,955 of the Library's economic contingency funds.

You will be seeing new faces at the Library! We welcomed new Youth Services Library Assistant, Kristen Short, on May 19th. Mrs. Short has six years of experience working in this capacity. Theresa Gonzalez and Stacey Osorio will be our two, new Pages. To create more flexibility with the Page scheduling, the position was divided into two 10- hour positions. We look forward to having all three of them as members of the Murrieta Library Staff!

Once again, many thanks to the Friends for your continued, tireless efforts of fundraising and volunteering help!!


