## MURRIETA PUBLIC LIBRARY NEWS ...from Loretta McKinney, Director of Library Services

#### Dear Friends ~

March 17 is coming fast and we all know what that means ~ the Murrieta Library celebrates its sixth birthday in our beautiful "new" Library! According to the comments we receive from the library patrons, the Library facility is still a warm and welcoming facility that complements the high stan-

dards of the community it serves! Library and City staff take extra efforts to maintain the facility as well as to keep it clean and operating at its optimum; after all, this is *your* Library! Aside from the facility itself, I would like to share some real numbers about what takes place *inside* the Library. Sometimes we routinely frequent certain shops, restaurants, and stores for our services and we forget that many others also routinely use the same venues. When you look at the numbers below, you will realize that you are one of the 1,000 people that visit the Library *every day*! Before we moved into the new facility, you might remember the Library was in a 4,000 square foot renovated bank building. There was little room by 2006 for collections and minimal room for programs. Essentially, we had 35,000 volumes and maybe held 10 programs through the year. Keeping this in mind, I would like to share some of the fiscal year 2011-2012 statistics, gathered by Principal Librarian Elise Malkowski for the State Library Annual Statistical Report, that reflect how busy your Library is every day!

Next year, the Library community will celebrate the 15<sup>th</sup> birthday of the establishment of the Murrieta Public Library, which opened its doors for the first time on April 10, 1999!

On the heels of the Library's Birthday, April brings National Library Week from April  $14^{th}$  through the  $20^{th}$  with the theme "Communities Matter @ Your Library." In addition to the Día de los niños ~ Día de los libros (Day of the Child ~ Day of the Book) celebration on Saturday, April 27, watch for other news of special programs for YOU our Library Community!

April is also National Volunteer Month and Library Staff Appreciation Day. If you remember, please take a minute to thank the volunteers in the Friends Bookstores as well as those who give their personal time in the Library for their generosity! All of those numbers above could not be accomplished by 17.5 FTE staff alone! Murrieta Public Library is a public library for the people, by the people!

One last bit of information: due to the Tour de Murrieta event, the Library will be closed on Saturday, March 9. The bookdrops will be open, but traffic will be snarly!

She has a delightful sense of humor, a wonderful memory always relating a story from the past. We marvel at all she has stored away and can recall.

Hellen was one of the original charter **Lifetime** members of the Friends—joining in 1998. She also contributes refreshments regularly for our monthly general meetings. There is no stopping her or slowing her down. How fortunate the Friends are to have Hellen as a hardworking, fun-loving, much involved member.
