

Welcome back everyone -- hope you all had a pleasant summer.

We are ready to start our readings to the **HeadStart** preschoolers on September 18th. We always give a gift book to each of the children every December and would appreciate your donation of \$5 or more - we have collection envelopes at each of the bookstores, or you can mail your check to: FOML, at P. O.

Box 235, Murrieta, CA 92564. **HeadStart** has added an additional classroom this year, so we must purchase **96** books. Fortunately, we will be working with Candlewick Press again and through their supplier Random House, we do receive the books at a discount so there are no shipping fees. Anything you can do to help fund these books is appreciated. This is an Outreach Program of the Friends and a very worthwhile project.

I am still hoping to meet my goal of 300 members before my term ends in January, 2014. There are only 50 spaces to fill, so please encourage your Murrieta friends and family to join. Membership can be as low as \$15 annually. If you are interested in converting your membership to Lifetime, the cost is **only \$250.00**, which entitles you to a leaf on the **Giving Tree** just inside the library. It's a wonderful way to support the Library through the Friends. All our funds eventually support the Library through the Collection Development Fund and the various programs the Library offers, including the summer reading program and the fall and winter children, adult & teen programs.

Dear Friends-

Summer is coming to a close and fall is just around the corner. I'd like to say a great big thank you to the Friends for their continued support of our Summer Reading Program. Once again, we had a most successful and fun reading program and we couldn't do what we do without YOU! As always, the staff did an amazing job implementing the Summer Reading Program and training the multitude of volunteers it takes to help run the Program. Staff worked hard planning and presenting 22 events that had a total attendance of over 1700 community members of all ages. On behalf of the Library staff and the Teens of Murrieta, we'd like to say thank you to Carol Carson for her generous support of the Teen **Read for a Reason** component. The Teens read 95,840 pages and raised \$958.40 for Animal Friends of the Valleys. Carol Carson rounded up the total and \$1,000 was donated to the Animal Friends of the Valleys.

We have some exciting programs planned for fall and winter, some of which include Jedi Training for ages 4-12, Catching Fire and More for grades 6-12 and Beginning Yoga for adults. For those of you who know college-bound teens, there are several special programs coming up such as practice tests for the SAT/PSAT/ACT exams, all of which are free and open to the public! In addition to specific press releases, more information about these exciting programs can be found in a variety of places: the Library's web page at www.murrietalibrary.info or stop by one of the Library service desks and pick up a calendar.

In accordance with City Policy and the Murrieta Municipal Code, in a staggered manner, City Commission seats are set to expire after serving at least two terms, on June 30th of every year. This year, we recognize the valuable input of time and energy given by Commissioner Phyllis Osborne and thank her for giving the gift of herself to the Murrieta Public Library through her service on the Library Advisory Commission!

I would like to introduce and welcome our incoming Library Advisory Commissioner, Nicole Martinez and I look forward to working with her throughout her term. The Library Advisory Commission meetings are held at 6:00 PM in the City Council Chambers on the third Monday of each even month throughout the year with the exception of February when the meeting is held on the second Monday. The meetings are open to the public and the agendas are posted in front of City Hall as well as on the City/Library website prior to the meeting.

Lastly, beginning September 3^{rd,} the Library will begin offering patrons the ability to pay their overdue fees online through our web page using PayPal.

We would like to remember Arlean Garrison who passed away in July at the age of 97. Arlean is a pioneer Murrietan. She and Victor, her fiancé, came to this area in 1936. A few vears later Victor bought the machine shop on Washington Avenue, which is still in business. They bought the house right alongside the machine shop and were married there in 1940. Victor was assistant fire chief of the volunteer fire department and the first fire engine was housed in their machine shop.

During World War II Arlean was among those assigned to watch the skies for enemy aircraft. She wrote a newspaper column for 20 years "Down Murrieta Way." This led to her writing a book "My Children's Home—A History of Murrieta, California." In 1985 she organized the parade that celebrated the 100th anniversary of Murrieta. She helped establish the Murrieta Garden Club and was a long time member of the Friends of the Murrieta Library.

In John Hunneman's column on July 17, he tells about his last visit with Arlean. She showed him a model of the museum she hoped would one day be built in the community. That is some-thing many of us would also like to see become a reality. The family requested in lieu of flowers that donations be made to the Pioneer Park Fund of the Historic Downtown Murrieta Association.

Dave Haas, another staunch Murrietan who was actively involved in the Murrieta Cityhood campaign and was a councilman on Murrieta's first city council after the city was incorporated, in 1990. Dave passed away on July 30th in Lone Pine where he had moved some years ago and continued to be active and involved in all aspects of that city. Dave was well known around Murrieta for all he did for the city but especially for his snake-enhanced cowboy hats that he was never without. Services were held in Lone Pine on the 17th.

We bid both of these stellar characters a fond farewell and are grateful for their many contributions to the city of Murrieta.

Helen Kalbfleisch — On a more cheerful note, we want to remember Helen who is 99 years old and still going strong. Helen was on the original board of the Friends of the Murrieta Library when it was started in 1996 and she served as its Treasurer for many years. Helen always looked like a fashion plate and her charm and warm smile added so much to our meetings.

She has moved to a retirement home but has maintained her membership in the Friends even though she can no longer attend meetings or be an active participant. We want her to know she is missed and we wish her well.
