Over 125 life-size metallic sculptures are scattered over three non-contiguous square miles of Borrego Valley surrounded by the immense Anza-Borrego Desert State Park. Sculptor Ricardo Breceda's Sky Art is the perfect blend of stunning craftsmanship and placement in open desert landscape. Sculptures have evolved into whim and fantasy: something for everyone on this large desert palette. Sculptures include Plio-Pleistocene animals that once roamed this desert, Spanish explorers, bighorn sheep and dinosaurs

Startling and stunning as these imaginative sculptures are, the story of how they came to be is just as fascinating. In just a few short years following a devastating accident, Breceda has become a famous artist featured on public television, news media, magazines, and global blogs.
