

Our New Year's resolution is to get more members, Bookstore volunteers and Friends to our general meetings.


Our Membership Drive in 2019 went very well. We have 223 members, 99 of whom are Lifetime members. Our newest members in November and December include:

MURRIETA PUBLIC LIBRARY NEWS ...from Elise Malkowski, Library Manager

Dear Friends,

Happy New Year! As we welcome 2020 and look ahead to another successful year, I'd like to say thank you for your continued support and generous donations throughout 2019. Our stellar programs and collections are the result of your hard work and dedication in raising funds for the Library.

The Murrieta Public Library will soon have mental health book kits for adults and children and can be checked out for two weeks. The adult kits include books and resource links for topics such as PTSD, depression and anxiety. The children's kits include a game or toy with books and resource links on topics such as empathy, sadness and anxiety. Dementia/Alzheimer kits will also become available in the near future and will include a kit for caregivers, and memory lane kits that have games, music CDs, conversation cards and memory books for the 1940's, 1950's and 1960's. The kits were obtained through the Mental Health Initiative of the California State Library.

Upcoming programs include **CoderDojo**; a new program that will begin in January and continue on select Wednesdays throughout the winter and spring. In this new program, geared for ages 7-17, attendees will develop coding skills and explore their creativity. The popular **ACT** practice test for teens will be on Saturday, January 11 from 12-4:30 p.m. and **How to Go to College without Going Broke** will be held on Monday, February 3 from 6-8 p.m. The adults will have an opportunity to attend **Estate Planning**: **Wills and Trusts** on Tuesday, January 14 at 6 p.m. and **Special Needs** Planning on Tuesday, January 21, also at 6 p.m. **Using Social Media for Your Business** will be on Tuesday, February 11 at 6 p.m.

The Library will be closed on Monday, January 20 for Martin Luther King Jr. Day and February 17 for Presidents Day.

Have a wonderful 2020! We look forward to seeing you throughout the year!


