

There is no doubt that Joann and Cheyenne are now happily reunited.





As our Membership Chair Sandra was innovative in acquiring new members. Sandra was also a good fundraiser. Over the years she came up with many ideas including partnerships with local restaurants and creating a Historical Murrieta calendar. Sandra was always encouraging us to try new ideas, participate in all Murrieta's activities and constantly promote our great library.

On November 15, 2011, Sandra received a personal Proclamation from the City of Murrieta citing her many involvements in many organizations but especially activities pertaining to the Friends of the Murrieta Library, Her tremendous efforts in heading up the volunteers for the Library were much appreciated by the then Library Director, Loretta McKinney. In her letter to Sandra she stated "We value your service and the personal time you give to the community by helping us at the Library. BREAKING NEWS.....

Our Murrieta Police Chief, Chief Hadden, is retiring. Chief Hadden began his career in law enforcement at the age of 19, graduating from the Police Academy on his 20th birthday. In 1992 he came to Murrieta, helping launch the newly formed Murrieta Police Department. He became one of the first 25 original sworn police officers.

Today, the department employs 101 sworn officers, 55 professional staff members and over 40 volunteers, both men and women. He was promoted through the ranks until reaching Police Chief in 2013. Chief Hadden has received many awards, including a Chief's Citation in 1998 and the department's Distinguished Service Award in 1999.

He and his family are longtime residents of Murrieta and he has been a big part of setting the tone for the successful and respected department we have today. We, as a community are sad to see him leave, and thank him for his many years of service and helping to build the best Police Department possible.

Editors note: I attended the Murrieta Citizen's Police Academy and it was one of the most rewarding experiences of my life. You learn about each department – and there are many – and how enthusiastic the officers are about their jobs. I was asked at the graduation what impressed me the most and after some reflection, because they were all impressive, decided it was their involvement with children of all ages in our schools. Every citizen should take this class. It is well worth your time.


