Board of Directors Election

We have a unique election cycle this year. Due to the COVID emergency, Board positions were extended for one year in January of 2021. Therefore, Friends of the Murrieta Library does not have positions up for election at the January 2024 General Meeting. However, there does exist one appointed position with a term expiring in 2025. Article V, Section 5 regarding vacancies states, "a successor Director shall serve until the next election at which time the unexpired term shall be filled by the candidate having the most votes after the regularly elected positions have been filled". Given this vacancy, we will hold an election for the one unexpired Director position at the January General Meeting.

- Individual Memberships of the Corporation shall have one vote.
- Family category shall have a maximum of two votes. Members must be 18 years of age to vote.
- All lifetime members, if a couple, also have two votes.
- The election to fill the one Director's position will be held at the January 2024 General Meeting and voting will again be available by email prior to the meeting.
- Program Chairs and Board Officers will be elected by the 2024 Directors after the January 2024 General meeting.

Membership in good standing is required to participate in this election or to run for a Director or Chair position.

Town Square Bookstore Update

Welcome 2024 and Hau'oli Makahiki Hou,

Thanks to our volunteers and our customers, we had a wonderful year at the Town Square Bookstore. Although we are only open Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday 10 AM to 4 PM, and on Saturday from 1 to 4 PM, we earned more than the previous year. The August Overstock Sale and our Internet Sales truly helped with our income. Our customers continue to support us by buying books, CDs, DVDs, and giving donations of money and books. We take in approximately 250 plus books per week. Some qualify for our Internet program and the others are cleaned, priced, and shelved for purchase. Since we have such a small store, we have instituted our "daily overstock sale" by having books, CDs, DVDs on sale outside the store for 50 cents each. This has helped generate more customers and more purchases on a daily basis.

Also, our electronic "Square", allowing customers to use their credit cards, has allowed customers to purchase, "just one more item" and extend our daily income at the store. This has been an amazing and successful addition to our store. Our wonderful volunteers enjoy using it and see the difference this has made in our daily sales. We are so grateful for this lucrative innovation.

Thank you once again to our amazing volunteers who show up regularly and do an amazing job with our customers as well has cleaning, pricing, and shelving materials. As always, we need MORE volunteers, so if you are interested, please stop by the store.


