After a year of research and meetings, the long awaited groundbreaking for the Children's Area Expansion Project took place in September. Who would have thought in the mid nineties, when the founding members of the Friends began their fundraising activities for an actual town library, that new accommodations would be needed so quickly since the opening of our Library in 2007.

I am proud to say that your Board of Directors, because of the hard work of the Bookstore Volunteers, has committed \$100,000 to the furniture, fixtures and equipment for the Childrens Area as required at the completion of the project. Close to an additional \$10,000 of private donations has been made to the Friends specifically for the Children's Area. The Friends have already provided \$73,516 in 2025 towards the collections for their annual donation for programming. Again, we thank Corner Store Manager Nancy Dixon, and Town Square Managers Karen Michaud and Evie Dial, and their teams, for their daily dedication. So be sure to utilize the convenience of the bookstores and donate as well, and buy your next great read from one of them. It is through these two stores that we are able to donate so much to our beloved Library.

Murrieta Public Library Update

Dear Friends,

As we welcome 2026 and look ahead to another year, I'd like to say thank you for your continued support and generous donations throughout 2025. Your dedication, time, and effort at the bookstores and volunteering in various ways are crucial in providing our community with an amazing Library, and we are sincerely thankful for your support.

Coming in February is "Love Your Library" month. This month-long celebration of school, public, and private libraries of all types is a time for everyone, especially library support groups, to recognize the value of libraries and to work to ensure that the Nation's libraries will continue to serve. In recognition of this celebration, the Murrieta Public Library will waive \$1.50 of fines for each non-perishable food item brought to the Library's Customer Services Desk. The maximum number of fines waived is \$15.00. This is a great way to reduce or eliminate the fines from your library account and help those in the community who need assistance. The donations will be given to the Murrieta United Methodist Church.

Construction continues on the Children's Area Expansion Project with an expected completion date of late this summer. Furniture, fixtures and equipment are in the process of being ordered and plans are underway for the low-voltage work such as the video/camera, public address and access control systems.

The Library will be closed on Monday, January 19, for Martin Luther King Jr. Day, and Monday, February 16, for Presidents Day.

And last but certainly not least, it is with deep sadness that we share the news of the passing of Steve Herring, a long-time member of the Murrieta Public Library team.

Steve began his career with the Library on October 2, 2000, when the Library was still located in the Los Alamos Shopping Plaza. Over the course of 25 years of dedicated service, he became the Library's longest-tenured employee, working his way from Library Assistant to Librarian II in Adult Services.

Throughout his career, Steve played an integral role in serving the Murrieta community. He led and supported numerous successful programs, including partnerships with the Murrieta Police Department and the California Highway Patrol, oversaw the Zip Books program, and ensured the completion of the Library's annual State Library Report. For many residents, Steve was best known as the welcoming and familiar face at the reference desk, where generations of Murrieta patrons came to know him as friendly, approachable, and deeply committed to excellent customer service.

As part of his long-standing connection to the Library and the community, Steve shared his thoughts about the Library's growth and future as part of a local history video series produced by the Murrieta Public Library. Steve was also a Murrieta resident, and his loss is felt not only by his colleagues, but by the broader community he served for so many years.
