# **Murrieta Public Library Updates**

Dear Friends,

National Friends of the Library Week was celebrated during the week of October 16-22, 2022. In honor of all your contributions and support of the Library, the Murrieta City Council issued a proclamation on October 18, 2022, to honor the Friends of the Murrieta Library. It was my honor and privilege to introduce the proclamation at the City Council meeting, and I genuinely consider it a highlight of my career. Since I started as the current Library Manager in January 2022, I have been thoroughly impressed with the dedication and passion displayed by Friends members, volunteers, and board members, including all the hard work that goes into operating two bookstores and the sidewalk sales. I want to extend my appreciation to each of you for what you do to support our Library.

I am also thrilled to announce that the Library has recently been notified that we have been awarded four significant grants bringing us much cheer for this holiday season.

First, we have been selected to receive the California State Library's Building Forward Infrastructure Grant. The Library has been awarded approximately \$1,500,000 with a 50% reduction for the required match amount to fund an expansion of the Children's area and an addition of a storytime room into the Carol Carson Garden of Verses, which will fulfill the original intent to expand the Library in the future.

The Building Forward Infrastructure Grant alone is exciting news, but the Library also received award notifications for three other grants from the California State Library:

- Seed Library Grant: \$18,050
  - Funding for improving and enhancing the seed library with furniture, new display units, additional seeds, and a sign-up kiosk.
- Sustainable California Libraries Grant: \$30,000
  - Funding for a pollinator/native garden outside the Library, sustainability workshops, the Library's annual Earth Day Celebration, and humane bee traps and removal.
- Zip Books Grant: \$21,128
  - Funding for the Zip Books program, where Library users can request books not found in the Library's collection, and the Library will order them on Amazon and have them shipped to the user's home. Then the book will be added to the Library's collection after it is returned.

In total, the Library has secured \$1,574,803 in funding for the projects noted above, which I believe will take our Library to the next level. While these grants provide additional funding to complete significant projects like the building expansion, we will need the continued support of the Friends for additional programs and enhancing our collection as we grow and expand. The Library would not be where it is today without the support of the Friends, and we are excited to have your continued support as we go into the next chapter of our Library together.


# Fundraiser at The Mill November 15, 2022
