

Board of Directors Election

We have a unique election cycle this year. Due to the COVID emergency, Board positions were extended for one year in January of 2021. Therefore, Friends of the Murrieta Library does not have positions up for election at the January 2024 General Meeting. However, there does exist one appointed position with a term expiring in 2025. Article V, Section 5 regarding vacancies states, "a successor Director shall serve until the next election at which time the unexpired term shall be filled by the candidate having the most votes after the regularly elected positions have been filled". Given this vacancy, we will hold an election for the one unexpired Director position at the January General Meeting.

- Individual Memberships of the Corporation shall have one vote.
- Family category shall have a maximum of two votes. Members must be 18 years of age to vote.
- All lifetime members, if a couple, also have two votes.
- The election to fill the one Director's position will be held at the January 2024 General Meeting and voting will again be available by email prior to the meeting.
- Program Chairs and Board Officers will be elected by the 2024 Directors after the January 2024 General meeting.

Please contact Parliamentarian, Nancy Eberhardt at <u>Neberhardt66@gmail.com</u> no later than December 15, 2023 if you are interested in becoming part of the Board of Directors or a Chairperson of a committee or for more information on the duties of the Directors and Chairs. Membership in good standing is required to participate in this election or to run for a Director or Chair position.

The plans for the Children's Area expansion project are moving along. The design firm is preparing the schematic design and an in-depth cost analysis, and we anticipate their submittal in December. A presentation of the design and project budget will be given to City Council sometime in January. Designing and planning materials will be placed at City facilities advertising the project and inviting the community to follow the progress.

A wide variety of programs and events are coming up for all ages. For children, storytimes continue on Tuesdays and Wednesdays through November, and Dog Tales continues on Monday afternoons through December 11. There will also be two STEAM Studio workshops on November 9 and November 30 and a Game Night on December 1. Teens can look forward to another Arcade

event on November 16, as well as two Cricut Maker workshops, one on November 20 and another on November 21. For adults, there will be a Beginning Pastels program on December 6. Staff is also planning and preparing creative take-home kits for all ages. 



Programs

For our last program of this year, we promise not to disappoint as we welcome local Author, Rob Crisell. This esteemed author is a resident of Temecula, California, and is not only a writer, but a teacher and actor and served as an editor at "Highlights for Children Magazine" in the 1990s. Since then, he has edited for several magazines and book publishing houses. For the past decade, Rob has taught poetry and Shakespeare in local school districts, primarily to fourth and fifth graders. His poetry has been featured in "The Lyric" magazine, the Society of Classical Poets, and others. He is a graduate of Yale University and George Mason School of Law.



Rob Crisell will introduce us to his latest book, <u>Temecula Valley</u> <u>Wineries</u>. Rob planted Syrah in his vineyard 10 years ago. The month of September is Temecula's traditional grape harvest month. This past September was good to Rob as he sold two tons of Syrah

from his vineyard, and had his new book coming out from Arcadia Publishing, a house that specializes in regional history books with plentiful photos. While Temecula's grape growing history goes back 200 years, Crisell's book focuses on the here and now. In a phone interview, he said Temecula is unique due to the large numbers of varietals grown there - roughly 40 - and the tourism experience it provides. He will talk about his research, interviews with the winemakers and owners of Temecula vineyards, and his own winemaking experiences.

Rob promises to entertain our children too with his other book, <u>The Fantastic Fables of Aesop</u>. This book can be found in our Murrieta Children's Library. It is a story about Aesop, a legendary Greek storyteller. Aesop entertained and enlightened millions of people around the world with his delightful fables about lazy grasshoppers, arrogant rabbits, magical geese, dishonest shepherd boys, and other characters. Some call him the wisest person who ever lived. His stories and morals delight even as they educate and enlighten. Rob Crisell has transformed these wellknown tales into hilarious poems, bringing them to life for young and old alike. Along with Jamie Nicole Jones' gorgeous illustrations, <u>The Fantastic Fables of Aesop</u> will make readers smile even as it makes them think.

Everybody is welcome to attend and we look forward to seeing you, Tuesday, November 14, 2023. Arrive early to experience all the Murrieta Library offers, then join us at 3:30 p.m. in The Murrieta Library Community Room for the program and refreshments provided by FOML. 


