The Law of Innocence By Michael Connelly



Dear Friends,

I hope this newsletter finds you all well and healthy. On March 14 it will be one year since we closed due to COVID-19. As I look back over the year, we've had a lot of schedule changes with staff working together, staff being split into two shifts, full telecommuting and back to being split into shifts. We've accomplished much in the past year including developing a curbside service so patrons could still have access to materials, Take Home Kits for all ages so our patrons still have an opportunity to do something fun at home, and we really increased our social media presence including adding virtual storytime. I'm proud of the staff for their patience, creativity and hard work during the closure. Below are some statistics from the past year:

- 58,066 items were checked out
- 4,860 items were purchased and added to the collection
- 877 new patrons were registered
- 7,000 curbside delivery appointments were made
- 1,600 Take Home Kits for all ages were created and handed out
- Freading was added, a new e-book collection

I'm also happy to report that the Murrieta Public Library was awarded an \$8,000 Copy Cat grant to expand the Library's Take Home Kit program for all ages. We chose Contra Costa County Library's Creative Thursdays as an inspiration, but instead of doing live programming at our library, we will provide the materials for our community to create/make/experiment in the safety of their own home and we will be calling the program Murrieta Makes. We have committed to do at least 24 differently themed Take Home Kits that will be handed out each month from March to July.

**First and Foremost** is the heart and soul of our town, our incredible **Murrieta Public Library** offering a never ending supply of materials, and programs designed to please and educate all ages; staffed with pleasant, knowledgeable, multi-talented, librarians. It will open again soon when allowed due to COVID.

**Bach Theater**...Unique style of small intimate live stage productions—their vision is to enrich, inspire, challenge and expand our world through the arts. Presently closed due to COVID but have a performance ready when they get permission to open again. Still offering Acting Workshops. Their number for information is (951) 696-7045.

<u>Murrieta Plaza</u>—Tucked away in this location are a variety of businesses and shops. <u>The Mill</u> with outdoor dining is a very popular restaurant; <u>Calhoun's Family</u> <u>Texas Barbecue</u>—mostly delicious take out and next door is the <u>Family Bakery</u>. You will find <u>Studio No. 3</u> a very delightful women's store and <u>Geronimo's</u> a most unusual men's store complete with barbershop. As well as <u>Honey, Stop the Car</u>—A place to find antiques plus, they do estate sales. It looks charming and the name alone makes you want to take a peek.

In the brick building adjacent to the Murrieta Plaza is <u>Anthony's Lounge & Ristorante</u> the oldest family owned restaurant in Murrieta with menus based on family recipes from Cambria, Italy. In the same building, a fairly new shop is the much frequented <u>The Crafted</u> <u>Scone</u> whose specialty is—what else—scones of all types.

Across from the Murrieta Plaza you will find <u>Wine</u> <u>Ranch Grill & Cellars</u> a full service restaurant and winery that offers wine tasting, American food and craft beer. A dog friendly patio!

Continuing down on Washington is the **Down Town PUBlic House** offering an ever changing "farm to table" menu with ample outdoor seating. In the same complex as the PUB is **Gypsy Sunset** another lovely women's dress and accessory shop that carries specialty items not seen elsewhere; together with **The Press Expresso Coffee** offering in-house roasted beans and craft coffee and freshly baked pastries.

All this conveniently located and walking distance along a very pleasant tree-lined street. In discovering these shops and restaurants, you will find Murrieta has everything you need. Shop and dine locally and keep your tax dollars in Murrieta. Starting at Ivy and Washington going east, next to the Murrieta Post office is one of Murrieta's "Gems," <u>Mae's Market and Boutique</u>, offering among other things....Fresh produce, fresh flowers, local honey, eggs, milk, jams, home décor and gift items. They also have many talented local vendors in their outdoor open-air market that occurs every three months. This Gem is <u>not to be missed</u>.

Then there is **Reborn Treasures** well stocked with a marvelous variety of all kinds of treasures. Take a quick coffee and donut break at Vista Donuts at the corner of B St. Turn north on B St. to another shop— Bailey's on B filled with all those artifacts and discarded remnants from the past you have been searching for. The indoor and outdoor space is constantly in flux. This shop reflects 5 generations of Baileys who made the journey from Kentucky west in a covered wagon. In the Donut Shop building area is a beautifully furnished shop, Jade, with mostly kitchenthemed items, but also a great selection of other home décor choices, both new and secondhand. Be sure and visit their patio area, too, that has music, fresh succulent arrangements, and pop-up paint and flower classes. Next to Jade in one of Murrieta's historic homes is where another BBO restaurant will be coming soon.

**Farmer's Market** (a) The Alleyway — 1st and 3rd Thursdays 4 to 8 PM — Shop 50+ local artisan and handmade articles. Stroll Washington to visit a multitude of restaurants, food trucks, shops and vendors. Shop a variety of special local made products...... (a) The Alleyway. Located on Juniper just off Washington and directly behind the Beauty Artisan Salon. Cannot say enough about this event that is getting more popular and more well attended each month. 
