

Murrieta Public Library Update

Dear Friends,

Fundraising efforts for the expansion of the Children's Area are ongoing, and Friends of the Murrieta Library members-as well as community supporters-can contribute directly to the Friends to help bring this vision to life. When donating, please be sure to specify that the contribution is for the Children's Library Expansion. Plans remain on schedule, with construction anticipated to begin in August 2025 and continue for approximately one year. In the month of February, the Circulation Services Department conducted the annual Food for Fines program in honor of Love Your Library month. Library patrons were able to donate a pre-packaged food item to waive \$1.50 per item, up to \$15. This program not only reduces the financial barrier for patrons to access the Library, but it also has a positive impact for those who are experiencing food insecurity. The donations were given to the Murrieta United Methodist Church's food pantry.

the Library has in store for all age groups. For children, Lapsit, Independent and Family Storytimes continue, as do the Dog Tales, Kid's Science Series, Art Studio and STEM Lab programs. The annual In-N-Out Cover to Cover Reading Club program begins on March 1 as well. For teens, programs include Game Nights, Chess Open Play, and a Safety Class, as well as some take-home kits in March. For adults, the Genealogy Meetups continue and there will be a Disaster Preparedness Fair held on Saturday, March 15 in the Community Room and Garden. Finally, the Library for All programs continue to be very popular and well-attended and participants can look forward to a March Madness Bingo Party, an Upcycled Art program, Karaoke Day and an Eggstravaganza.

The Library will be closed on Saturday, April 5, due to the Tour de Murrieta Bike Race.

Town Square Bookstore Update

Greetings and Happy Reading to all our Members.

The Town Square Bookstore has been a very busy place during January and February. We are blessed to have gained six new volunteers! We are grateful for more volunteers as the duties of a volunteer are many and keep everyone in the store very busy. Welcome to: Andre, Kiley, Anne, Elain, Greg, and Nancy to the team!

The store continues to receive at least 60 to 100 books per day, and often more. We rely on our team of volunteers to clean them, sort them, price them, and shelve them. Thank you to our volunteers!

What do we do with so many books in such a small space? Well, luckily we sell many everyday, but we also donate books to Murrieta Elementary School for the Free Book Library box we have stationed at the school. We take new books over once or twice a month. The books are a gift to the students from the Friends of the Murrieta Library.

We also have an Internet book project run by two amazing volunteers, Laurie and Art! They account for selling many books every month and earning us hundreds of dollars, as well!

In addition, we now have a monthly \$3 a bag book sale in the Community Room of the Murrieta Public Library. Our volunteers store books all month, then move them to the Community Room once a month for our sale from noon to 4 PM. We are earning at least \$300 per sale day between the store and the bag sale. Again, only

possible because of our dedicated volunteers. Upcoming dates are March 22 and April 26.

Last month our in-store books highlighted Presidents' Month, Black History Month, and Valentine's Day. In March, we will highlight Women's History Month, and a Touch of Ireland, as well.

Our thanks go out to all the customers who come into the store and search for their "treasures", often finding true gems for their home book collections.

Setting up for the Corner Bookstore Overstock Sidewalk sale is quite a project: there are a dozen heavy six foot tables, pop-up covers, and dozens of heavy boxes of books which have to be sorted and displayed in appropriate sections of fiction, non-fiction, children, and so forth. Thanks to the local Scouting America Troop 318, it was accomplished with great efficiency. We are so grateful for the hard work of Lucy Lemons, Neema Maria Mojo, Vivian Borude, Gavin deWald, Elija Guido-Graham, Sebastian Sanchez, Dylan Matusek, Faith Holub, and Michael Song, as well as their parents who also pitched in.



The "concert conductors" of this symphony were Kathy and Greg Cagle, with Stephanie and Eric Hubbard as "first violinists." Anxious customers are always lined up before our official opening, and Cathy St. Martin and Bob Granzow were there to handle the sales for the morning shift and Christy Zelenka for the afternoon. Inside sales kept the volunteers busy, with Stephanie Hubbard and Sheri Richter in the morning, and Sandra Havens and yours truly in the afternoon.

But it's not over yet, as when five o'clock arrives, everything has to be dismantled and brought inside to return to their "resting place" until the next sale (tentatively on June 21). Back again were the Cagles and the Hubbards, as well as more Scouts: Dylan Matusik, Parker Jones, and Julia Koch. A special thanks also to Julia's mother, Shelly Koch, who coordinated getting the Scouts to volunteer.

And was it all worth it? MOST CERTAINLY! We made between the outside and inside sales a total of \$1,764! In addition to the money, one of the on-going benefits is the number of new customers we get. We had inside one after another, after another, exclaiming what a "wonderful find," and proving it by purchasing literally piles of books. They also repeatedly said "I'll be back!"

When I think "Murrieta" I think "Community," and this was a stellar example from the volunteers to the customers, and all the thousands of donated books in between that gave us the wherewithal to turn the day into a success for the customers, for the Corner Store, and, of course, ultimately for our wonderful Murrieta Public Library.
