As summer begins, I'm pleased to share a brief update and welcome you to an exciting season at the Murrieta Public Library.

We are currently in a period of transition, and I am serving as Interim Library Manager while our Library Manager, Melvin Racelis, is serving as the Interim Parks and Community Services Manager. During this time, our commitment to serving the community remains strong, and we appreciate your continued support.

The Children's Library Expansion project is in full swing with sewer, water and various concrete work being done and the roofing work scheduled to begin sometime in mid-May. Staff is excited to launch the 2026 Summer Reading Challenge, "Plant a Seed, Read.", which will run from June 8 to July 18. It's a celebration of growth, curiosity, and the joy of reading for all ages. We invite you to join us for a variety of programs and activities designed to inspire and connect our community. For adults, there will be an Audio book Walking Club, a Tote Painting and History Workshop and a Jigsaw Puzzle Competition. For teens, there will be a focus on celebrating America's 250th Birthday with programs such as A Stroke of History: Cursive and Creative Expression, A Stitch in Time: Victorian-Inspired Sewing and Embroidery, and Coiled and Connected: Old Style Basket Weaving. Our Library for All group will have the chance to enjoy programs such as a Wild Wonders Animal Show, Citrus and Sunshine: Old-Fashioned Lemonade Stand Trucker Hats and a Summer Bingo Party.

We invite you to join us on May 19 and June 16 in the Lab Room inside the Library. We are honored to welcome Guest Speakers and Local Authors, **Theresa Halvorsen** (5/19) and **Rebecca Farnbach** (6/16).

On May 19, we welcome Guest Author and Speaker, **Theresa Halvorsen**, who describes herself as an overly-caffeinated podcaster, editor, and author of non-fiction and speculative fiction works, including "Warehouse Dreams", "Lost Aboard", and "River City Widows". She lives in San Diego, is a podcaster for Semi-Sages of the Pages, and a co-owner and chief editor of No Bad Books Press. Theresa admits she can't pick a favorite genre. She loves everything about being an author. One of her latest editions is of the supernatural with two books already in this series. A prolific author, she claims she doesn't sleep and just loves to write.

In June, we welcome another prolific author, **Rebecca Farnbach**, to our Tuesday, June 16, monthly General Meeting. Rebecca will have you dreaming of delicious foods paired with local wines, as she walks us through recipes from her cookbooks and Temecula wine pairings. She is a writer, speaker, and expert on the history of the Temecula Valley. She teaches the history component of the Mt. San Jacinto College course for Temecula Wine Country associates and has co-authored several local history books including "Images of America: Temecula Wine Country". Rebecca is one of the go-to people when you want to know about the history of the Temecula Valley in Southern California. She and her husband Darell give most of their free time and energy to preserving the historic adobe Wolf Store and Vail Ranch headquarters where the Butterfield Trail brought travelers into Southern California and to the fledgling town of Temecula. Partnering with long-time residents of the valley, Rebecca has co-authored six local history books featuring vintage photographs and captions of the Temecula Wine Country, Old Town Temecula, Murrieta, Murrieta Hot Springs, and Fallbrook. She has received numerous writing awards which she will share with us.
