Student first and second place winners received medallions and gift cards in four categories: K-2, 3-5, 6-8, and 9-12. In addition, the judges awarded 28 Honorable Mention certificates. With over 630 entries this year, the judges had quite a challenge!

Thanks to support by the Friends, the evening awards ceremony featured Ina Buckner-Barnett, the Sunshine Storyteller, who enchanted the audience with stories and included younger members of the audience as actors. Did you know that seventy-seven million people, or onethird of Americans, from all walks of life, and older than 14 years use the public libraries or the libraries wireless networks to go online?

As I mentioned in my last letter to you, libraries nationwide celebrated National Library Week during the month of April with the theme of "Communities thrive @ your library". Coincidentally, two very credible reports were published in March and April 2010, that complement this year's National Library Week theme. The first report, "Opportunity for All: How the American Public Benefits from Internet Access at U.S. Libraries" was funded by the Institute of Museum & Library Services and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and the second report, "The State of America's Libraries 2010" was funded by the American Library Association.

The following is a summation of the "Opportunity for All" report:

Seventy-seven million people or one-third of Americans ~ from all walks of life ~ and older than 14 years use the public libraries or their wireless networks to go online;

People are searching for information regarding

Workforce development

Education

Health & wellness and

For the delivery of government services

In short, literally millions of people use the public library as a tool to connect them to information, knowledge and other opportunities.

Data from a January 2010 Harris Interactive poll is referred to in "The State of America's Libraries 2010" document and includes the following information: "The National survey indicates that some 219 million Americans feel the public library improves the quality of life in their community, an increase of 209.8 million reported in 2006...more than 223 million Americans feel that because it provides free access to materials and resources, the public library plays an important role in giving everyone a chance to succeed."
